IN RE: COURT OPERATIONS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

On March 16, 2020, the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern and Western

Districts of Arkansas suspended all IN COURT hearings until further notice in recognition of and

in deference to the possible pandemic ramifications of the COVID-19 virus. Since that time, the

Bankruptcy Clerk's offices in both Little Rock and Fayetteville, Arkansas, have remained open

and operational. In addition, the court has continued operations by conducting hearings and trials

both telephonically and by video conferencing and will continue to do so through June 30, 2020.

Beginning July 1, 2020, the court will resume IN COURT hearings in all divisions. The

guidelines for IN COURT hearings, including social distancing, will be available on the court's

website. The guidelines may be revised from time to time as the COVID-19 pandemic continues.

The court recognizes that there may be members of the bar or parties with special circumstances

who may not desire to attend IN COURT hearings. The guidelines address those special

circumstances. Anyone who does attend an IN COURT hearing will be expected to adhere to the

posted guidelines.
